Genesis 22 - The Promised Savior: Seeing Jesus In The Old Testament

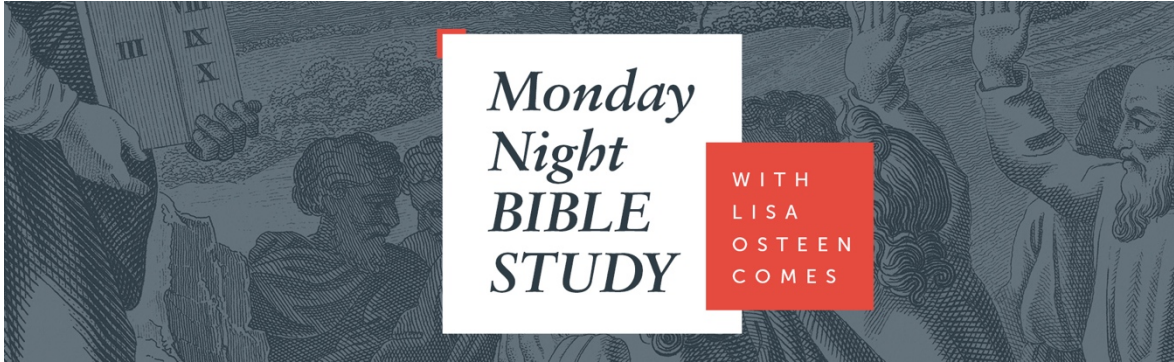
Abraham and Isaac

1. Isaac and Jesus' births were both prophesied. Genesis 17:16, Isaiah 7:14, Luke 1:31

2. Isaac and Jesus were sons both promised long before they were born. Genesis 12:1-3, Genesis 3:15

3. Isaac and Jesus both had a miraculous birth. Genesis 18:11, Matthew 1:1

4. An angel announced the news to Sarah and Mary. Gen 18:14, Luke 1:37

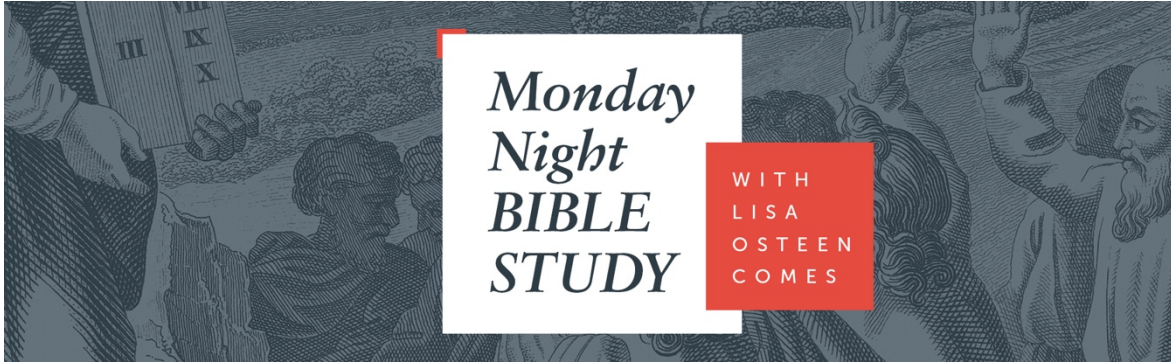
5. Isaac was the only son of promise and Jesus the only begotten of the Father. Genesis 22:2, John 3:16

6. God provided another sacrifice for Isaac. God provided Jesus as the ultimate sacrifice for the sins of the world. Genesis 22:13, John 1:29

7. Isaac was “considered” dead by his father for three days and Jesus was dead for three days. Genesis 22:4, 1 Corinthians 15:3-4

8. Isaac carried wood for his own sacrifice and Jesus bore His own cross. Genesis 22:6, John 19:17-18

9. Isaac submitted willingly to his father and Jesus submitted willingly to the Father. Genesis 22:6-8, Matthew 26:39

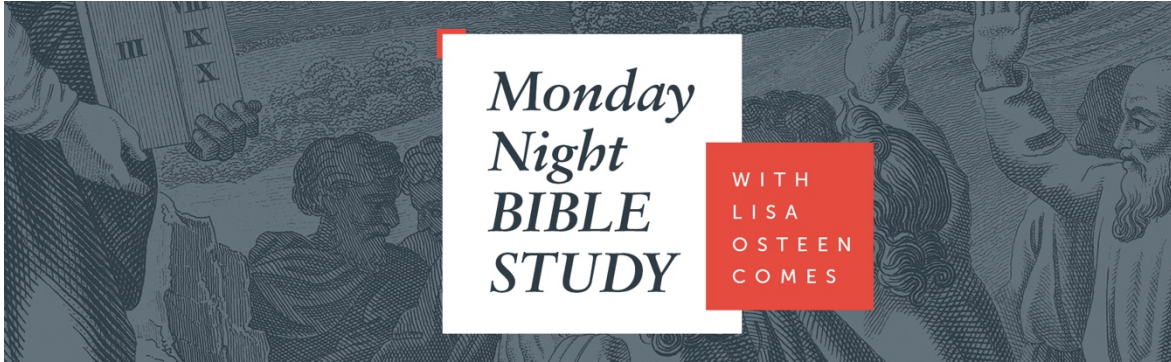
10. Isaac was raised from the altar with his life spared by the angel. Jesus was raised from the dead by the power of God. Genesis 22:11-12, Romans 6:41

11. Abraham sacrificed the ram caught in a thicket. Jesus was sacrificed with a crown of thorns. Genesis 22:13, John 19:2

12. Isaac and Jesus both rode a donkey to the place of sacrifice. Genesis 22:3-5, John 12:14-15

13. Isaac was to be sacrificed at Moriah, which is in Jerusalem where Jesus was crucified. Genesis 22:2|| Chronicles 3:1, Matthew 27:22

14. The name Abraham means *exalted father*. Our Heavenly Father is our Exalted Father. Genesis 17:5, Micah 6:6, Philippians 2:9

15. Abraham told the servants to stay behind and Jesus asked the disciples to stay behind at Gethsemane. Genesis 22:5, Matthew 26:38

16. Isaac had the power to save himself and refuse to be sacrificed. Jesus had the power to save Himself from the cross. Matthew 26:53-54

17. Abraham had an expectation that Isaac would be resurrected. Jesus was resurrected. Hebrews 11:17-19, Matthew 26:61, Luke 24:6-7
